#### Krimson-Haus Bathroom Renovation

In a compact, windowless bathroom tucked inside a Long Beach residence, KrimsonHaus transformed limitation into intention. The space—small, L-shaped, and previously underutilized—called for a design solution that felt expansive without excess, expressive without noise. The result is a moody, masculine, spa-like retreat where light becomes both atmosphere and architecture.

The client, a creative professional working in film furnishing, brought a strong visual sensibility to the project. While confident in materiality and composition, bathrooms required a more considered approach. With no natural light to rely on, illumination became the primary design tool—used not to dominate the space, but to sculpt it. The project serves as a residential lighting case study for interior designers seeking modern, architectural lighting solutions for compact bathroom spaces.

To counter the lack of windows, glass was thoughtfully introduced to help reflect and distribute light throughout the room. The color palette—black, white, and grey accented with subtle green tones—anchors the space in calm restraint, allowing texture, shadow, and contrast to take center stage.

Rather than traditional frontal lighting, the design avoids illuminating the face directly. Instead, light is used to highlight stone surfaces and architectural elements, creating depth and softness while reinforcing the spa-like atmosphere.

At the heart of the lighting concept is the Ramen Wall Sconce, chosen for its minimalist form and atmospheric glow. Installed in two sizes—9-inch at the bottom and 12-inch above—the staggered placement introduces a big-to-small rhythm that adds visual layering while maintaining functional illumination.

With its 360-degree diffused light and clean circular profile, the Ramen Wall Sconce functions as a quiet architectural gesture rather than a decorative focal point. Its backlit glow enhances the surrounding stone, allowing materiality to lead the narrative instead of overpowering it.



One of Ramen's defining features is its magnetically attached, paintable faceplate, which offers designers creative freedom to blend the fixture seamlessly into the wall, incorporate artwork or pattern, or adapt the finish over time. This flexibility makes Ramen a lighting solution that can evolve alongside the space itself.

Building on the ambient foundation created by Ramen, task lighting was introduced with equal restraint and precision. The Z-Bar Wall Sconce appears at the vanity in a matte black finish, installed using the center mount configuration for balance and symmetry.



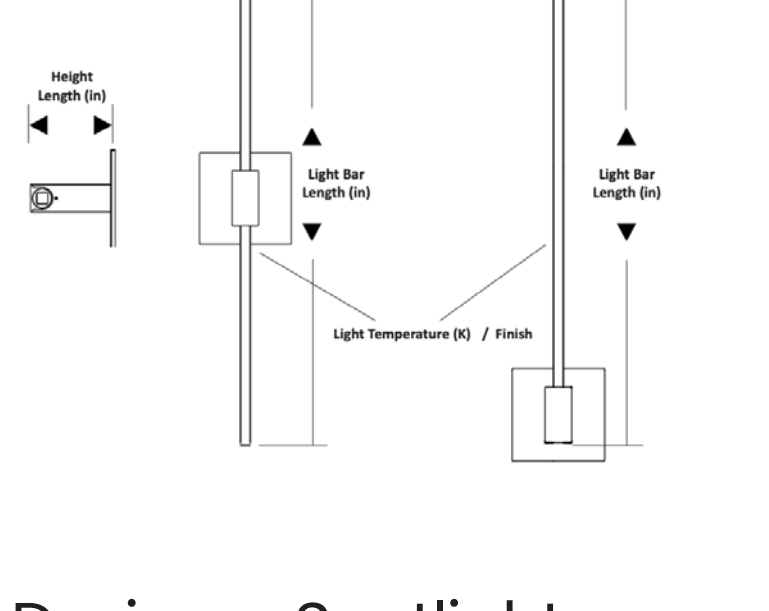
It's slim, linear form provides a deliberate contrast to the circular geometry of the Ramen sconces, adding a refined architectural counterpoint. The rotatable LED bar allows light to be directed exactly where needed, making it ideal for vanity and mirror illumination while remaining visually unobtrusive.

The Z-Bar Wall Sconce can be mounted vertically, horizontally, or diagonally, offering flexibility in both function and expression. In this space, it reads as both a lighting solution and a sculptural element—subtle, intentional, and modern. Founded in 2021, KrimsonHaus works across residential and commercial interiors, led by founder Christian Rosales alongside business partner Thomas Keen. This Long Beach project marked their first collaboration with Koncept, discovered through a search for lighting that felt minimal, modern, and design-forward.

Working directly with Koncept, the lighting phase progressed smoothly, allowing the design vision to remain intact from concept through completion.

This Long Beach bathroom demonstrates how thoughtful lighting design can redefine a small space. Through layered illumination, restrained material choices, and a balance of ambient and task lighting, KrimsonHaus created an environment that feels intimate yet expansive—where light doesn't just illuminate, but elevates.
